COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements

With reference to the [Government's new vaccine pass arrangement](#), the University will align its vaccination requirements accordingly to safeguard the health and safety of the University community. Details are as follows:

- Starting from 31 May 2022, all regular campus users (including students) must have received **three doses** of a COVID-19 vaccine to fulfil the University's vaccination requirement. All students are required to use "LeaveHomeSafe" mobile App to scan the venue QR code of the campus and then generate a "Vaccinated/Exempted" QR code (blue) before being allowed to enter university.
- New students should present the email copy of the 'EdUHK New Student Registration Notification' received from Registry to verify the student status while undergoing temperature check at the entrance security post.
- All students are required to submit their vaccination, testing records, and/or infection information via **the University's VTR online system**. Details will be announced by OCIO when your EdUHK student card is issued and ready for collection.
- Those unable to receive three doses of a COVID-19 vaccine will be required to produce a medical certificate as proof of being unfit for vaccination, report their medical exemption certificate information and produce a negative test result issued three days prior to the date of campus entry to the University's VTR online system. There will be a grace period for those who have received two doses within six months, but they are required to take the third dose within six months after receiving the second dose. For people who have recovered from COVID-19 infection, please refer to the Government's [website](#) for details and ensure the infection information is reported on the University's VTR online system.

Students are reminded to take note of the possible repercussions on their studies due to the denial of campus access, including failure to meet relevant attendance or course requirements and/or to attend in-person examinations.

The University will continue to strictly observe stringent infection control measures in order to protect the health and safety of all campus users. As always, we will closely monitor the situation and make adjustments accordingly.
