General Admission Requirements *

- Hold a recognised post-secondary qualification such as an Associate Degree / Higher Diploma preferably in areas such as Social Policy and Administration, Business, Management, Event Management, Social Administration, Applied Social Services, Communications, Education and Social Science related areas; or
- Be a final year student of recognised local Associate Degree / Higher Diploma programmes preferably in the above-mentioned disciplines (subject to successful completion of the programme with good GPA); or
- Be a transfer student who have completed at least two years of study of a 4-year full time degree programme in a recognised institution, preferably in the above mentioned disciplines; or
- Mature applicants (aged 25 or above on 31 August of the year in which applicants commence their studies) who have specific talents, achievements or a wealth of relevant experience; or
- If applicants have completed an associate degree or equivalent in other areas, their applications will be considered on a case-by-case basis
- # Applicants should also fulfil English and / or Chinese language requirement, unless exempted by the University; and pass the admission interview



Students admitted into this programme starting from the 2024/25 cohort are required to visit the Greater Bay Area (GBA) for a short trip (e.g. 1-day or 2-day 1-night trip) in order to complete the Cross-Faculty Core Course. While the GBA trip is heavily subsidised, students are still required to contribute 18% of the estimated cost of the trip ("student contribution"), whereas personal entertainment, meals expenses, travel document fee and personal insurance costs will not be supported. The estimated cost of the GBA trip for students admitted to the 2024/25 cohort is not available yet as it is subject to a variety of factors such as changes to the cost of the GBA trip as a result of inflation, trip duration, traveling expenses, the exchange rate, etc. The exact amount of student contribution is thus not available.
