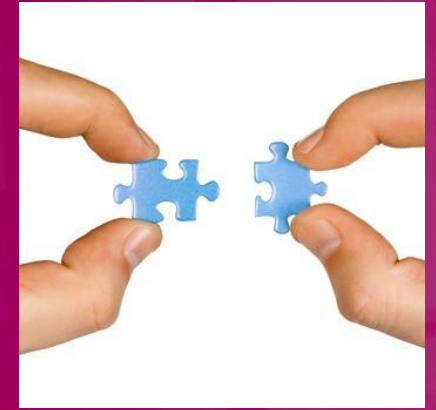

  - Final-year students of these AD/HD programmes
- **Interview may be required.**

# ENGLISH Language Requirement

The following is a list of acceptable tests and the score required:

Proficiency Tests	Minimum Requirements
<b>HKALE</b>	Grade E or above in ASL Use of English
<b>HKDSE</b>	Level 3 or above in English Language Level 2 or above in English Language (applicable to holders of a recognized AD/HD)
<b>TOEFL</b>	Paper-based: 550; or Internet-based: 80
<b>IELTS Academic</b>	Overall Band: 6
<b>GCE System</b>	Grade E or above in GCE AS-level or A-level English; or Grade C or above in IGCSE / GCE O-level English; or Grade C or above in GCSE English or English Literature
<b>IB</b>	Grade 4 in the Higher Level English Language (B Syllabus); or Grade 5 in the Standard Level English Language (B Syllabus); or Grade 4 in the Higher or Standard Level English Language (A1 or A2 Syllabus); or Grade 4 in the Higher or Standard Level English A: Language and Literature; or Grade 4 in the Higher or Standard Level English A: Literature; or Grade 4 in the Standard Level English-Literature and Performance; or Grade 4 in the Standard Level English-Text and Performance
<b>SAT</b>	A sub-score of 8 in Essay Writing in old SAT; or 590 in Evidence-Based Reading and Writing in new SAT
<b>Others</b>	Other English language qualifications deemed acceptable by the University.

## CHINESE Language Requirement

The following is a list of acceptable tests and the score required:

Proficiency Tests	Minimum Requirements
<b>HKALE</b>	Grade E in AS-level Chinese Language & Culture
<b>HKDSE</b>	Level 3 in Chinese Language Level 2 in Chinese Language (applicable to holders of a recognized AD/HD)
<b>GCE System</b>	Grade E or above in GCE AS-level or A-level Chinese; or Grade C or above in GCSE / IGCSE / GCE O-level Chinese
<b>IB</b>	Grade 4 in Chinese Language subject
<b>Others</b>	Other Chinese language qualifications deemed acceptable by the University.
