

#### **Programme Contents**

#### 1st Year

Students acquire basic business knowledge and skills, including **Accounting**, **Personal Finance**, **Management and Marketing**.









#### 2nd year to 4th year

Students proceed to study more in-depth theories and practical examples from the operational and organizational perspectives in each Major Core Area, such as Financial and Management Accounting, Human Resources and Small Business Management, Financial Management, Legal and Ethical Issues, and Technology in Business and Creativity, and "Investment" or "Strategic Management".

#### **3rd Year**

A 7-week **teaching practice** in secondary school.



#### 5th Year



The Final Year Project allows students the opportunity to explore areas of interest in a more independent and self-directed mode and a 7-week teaching practice in secondary school.

  - Block Practice II (7 cps); and
  - FE and Professional Learning Portfolio II (3 cps)

Students shall only take Field Experience and/or Experiential Learning Courses (including Co-curricular and Service Learning courses and Experiential Learning courses) and Honours Project / Capstone Project / University ePortfolio, but not other regular taught courses in the Field Experience and Experiential Learning Semester.




