SNDAS is introduced by the Education Bureau (EDB) with the aim of providing university education opportunities for talented S6 students who are assessed as suitable for their own preferred programmes based on broad parameters other than HKDSE examination results.





Admission Requirements for Associate Degree (AD) / Higher Diploma (HD) Students or Graduates

- Both AD/HD non-final year and final year students will be considered for admission.
- AD/HD holders with a good final GPA will be considered for admission to senior year places.
- Good interview results required.
- The programme reserves a number of Senior Year (i.e. Year 3) places for quality students holding AD/HD (or equivalent) qualifications. Admitted students are only required to take 60 credit points (cps) and can complete the programme in two years.




