

General Entrance Requirement

Students from all backgrounds are all welcome.

- a) Graduates of Associate Degree / Higher Diploma from a recognized institutions with a good GPA; or
- b) Final year students of a recognised Associate Degree/Higher Diploma programme or equivalent* (subject to successful completion of the programme by August with a good GPA)
- c) Transfer students who are currently enrolled in a Bachelor's degree or higher degree programme (considered on an individual basis)

- 1. Fulfil one of the following **English language** requirements:
 - Level 3 or above in HKDSE English Language; or
 - Level 2 or above in HKDSE English Language (applicable to holders of recognised AD/HD); or
 - Overall score of IELTS 6.0 (Academic version); or
 - TOEFL score of 80 (Internet-based); or
 - Passing the TOEFL ITP does not satisfy the English language requirement
 - MyBestTM Score is not accepted
 - Other English language qualifications deemed acceptable by the University
- 2. Pass the **Admission Interview**
