







Performance of EdUHK Geography in 2020:


EdUHK came 2nd (together with HKU) out of 4 universities


Mr Gabriel Lau, 2022 graduate

• <u>Other Language Subjects:</u> Other Language subjects will be used as unspecified elective subjects. The minimum requirement is Grade E






